A1 LOCATION

The Macarthur region is situated to the south west of Sydney and comprises local government areas of Campbelltown, Camden and Wollondilly. The region covers an area of 3,067 Km². It has a population of 250,000 and is home to 17,055 businesses. It is ideally located on major transport corridors with M5 and M7 being the major road networks that connect Macarthur to the rest of Sydney. The area is also serviced by commuter trains and work is nearing completion on the Southern Rail Freight Line which will be fully dedicated to movement of goods by rail freight to major distribution hubs in the Sydney region.

A1.1 Major Highlights

- ❑ The region, particularly Camden, is designated for a significant growth in population as envisioned in the Metropolitan Strategy.
- ❑ The region has a high diversity of business enterprises, including manufacturing, farming, service industries and mining.
- ❑ It is well endowed with natural amenities that provide diverse lifestyle choices and recreation.
- ❑ Macarthur hosts the University of Western Sydney Campus in Campbelltown, including its modern Medical School.
- ❑ Two TAFE colleges and public and independent schools serve the vocational training and education needs of the community.
- ❑ The Campbelltown hospital and other allied medical services provide the health care needs of the residents.

B1. GROSS REGIONAL PRODUCT

The size of the regional economy, measured by the Gross Regional Product (GRP) was \$8.3 billion in 2008/09. Key sectors comprising the GRP include: Manufacturing (13.8%), Mining (9%), Construction (6.1%), Education and Training (6%), Retail Trade (6%), Transport & Warehousing (5.8%), Health Care and Social Assistance (5.6%), Financial and Insurance Services (4.9%) and Wholesale Trade (4.3%).

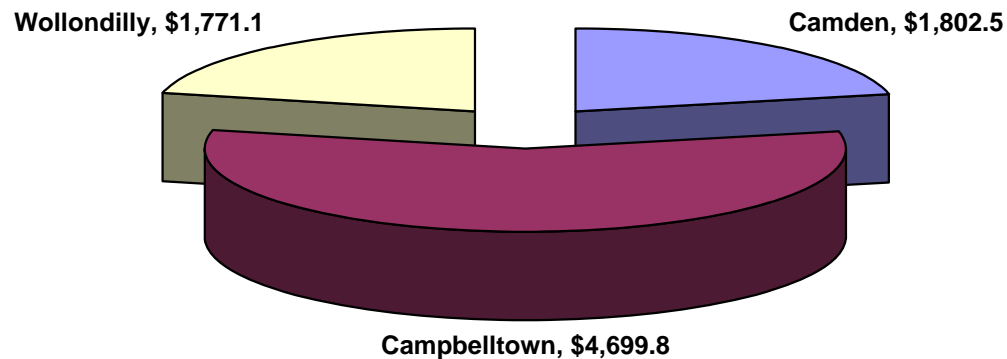
B1.1 Major Highlights

The breakup of the 2008/09 GRP is given below:

- Camden: \$1.8 billion, or 22% of the GRP. Manufacturing is the main activity, comprising 9.2% of its GRP.
- Campbelltown: \$4.7 billion or 57 % of the GRP. Manufacturing is the most dominant activity, accounting for 17.6% of its GRP.
- Wollondilly: \$1.7 billion or 21 % of the GRP. Mining is the predominant activity, making up 36.1% of the Shire's GRP.

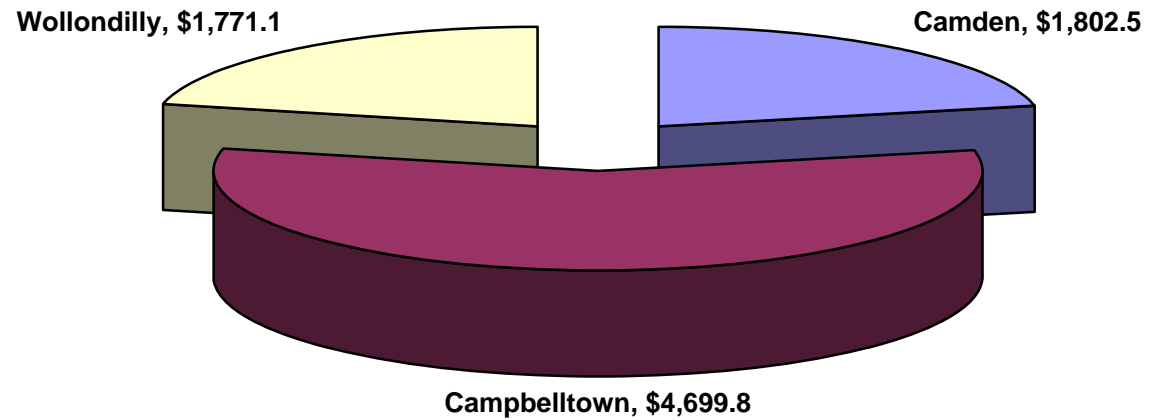

B3. JOBS IN MACARTHUR

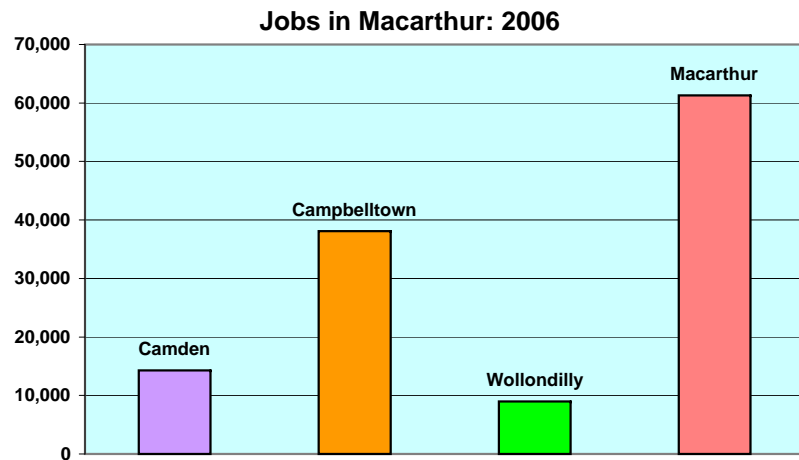
In 2006, there were 61,323 jobs in the Macarthur region. Manufacturing was the predominant source of employment, accounting for 15.2% of the total jobs, followed by Retail Trade (14.8%), Education & Training (11.2%) and Health Care and Social Assistance (10%). With the labourforce estimated at 113,526, the job sufficiency ratio comes to 0.54. This means that there were 1.85 potential job seekers for every job in the region. In 2006, 15,008 people from outside the region came to work in Macarthur and 60,269 from the latter traveled outside the region to work.

B3.1 Major Highlights

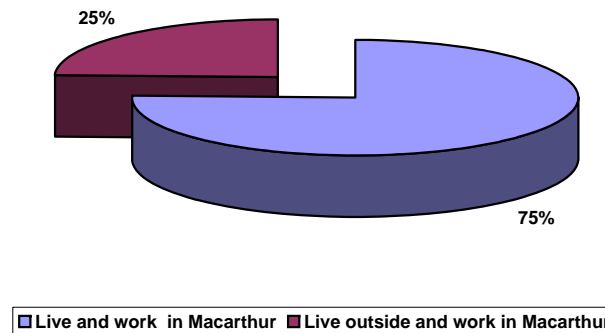
The number of jobs and the main employing industry in each of the LGA are shown below:

- 📍 Camden: 14,289 jobs were available in Camden, with Retail Trade being the most significant source of employment
- 📍 Campbelltown: 38,074 jobs were available in Campbelltown, with Manufacturing being the most significant source of employment
- 📍 Wollondilly: 8,960 jobs were available in Wollondilly, with Mining and Manufacturing being two equally significant sources of jobs.
- 📍 Macarthur: 61,323 jobs were available in the region, with Manufacturing being the most significant source of employment

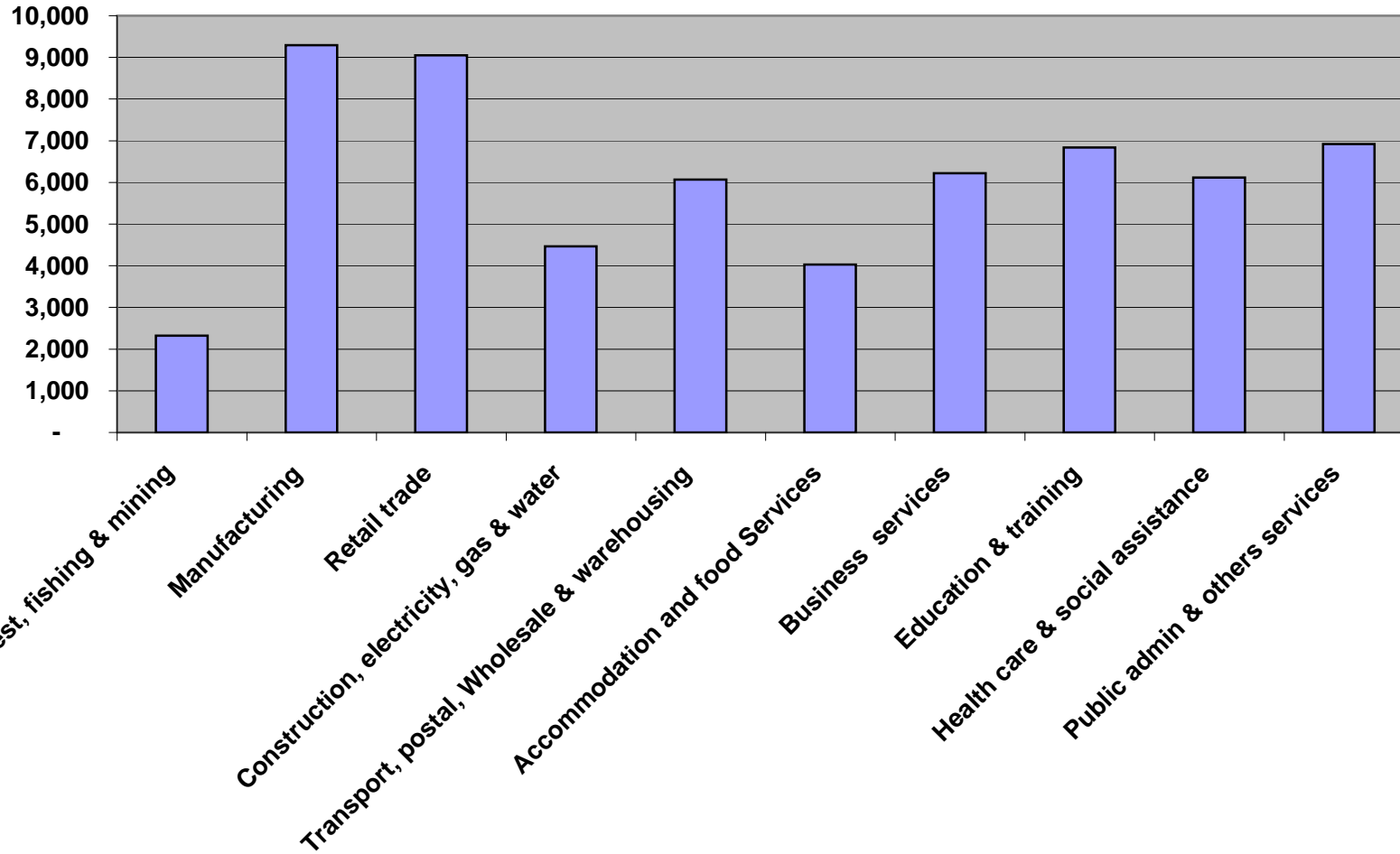

B 5. BUSINESS COUNT

There were 17,055 businesses operating in Macarthur in 2007. The most common type of business in the region was Construction (4,080) or 23.9% followed by Property and Business Services 3,549 (20.8%) and Retail Trade 1,965 (11.5%). Of the 7,524 employing businesses, 70.3% were employing between 1 to 4 persons, 22.6% 5-19 persons; 5.1% 20-49 persons and 2% over 50 persons.

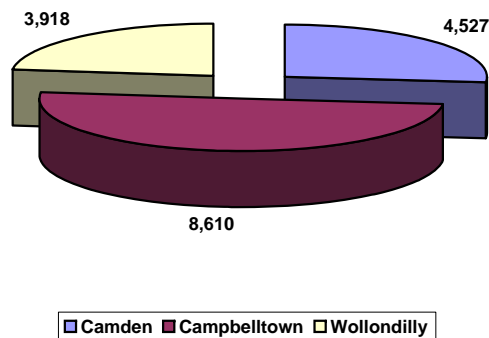

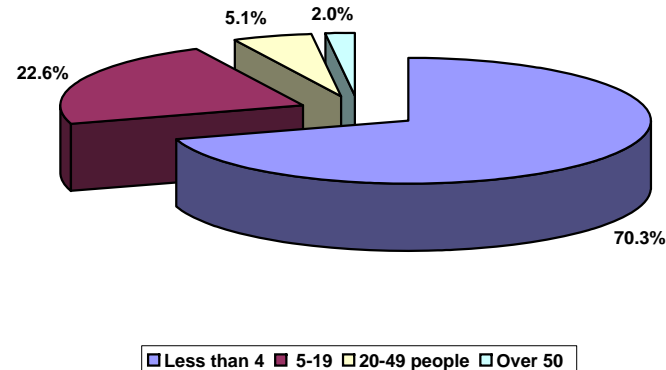

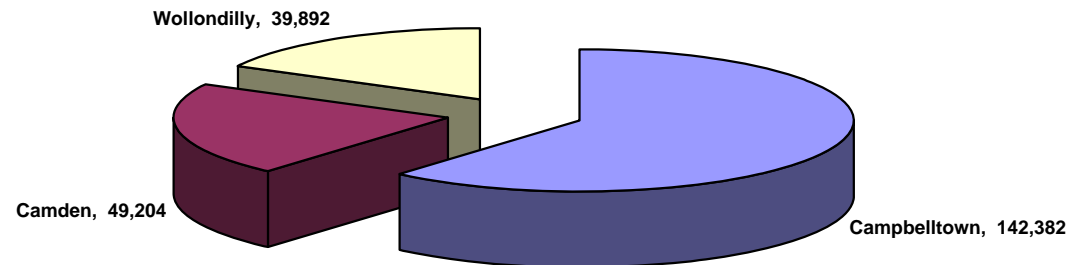

C 3. POPULATION FORECAST

According to the NSW Transport Data Centre population of the South West Sydney Region is expected to grow from an estimated 455,00 in 2011 to 869,00 in 2036. This planned growth of 414,000 people is part of the NSW Government's plan to accommodate a significant proportion of future growth in State's population in South West Sydney as foreshadowed in the Metropolitan Strategy. Excluding Liverpool, the population of the Macarthur region is expected to more than double over the 2011-2036 period, growing at an annual average rate of just over 4%.

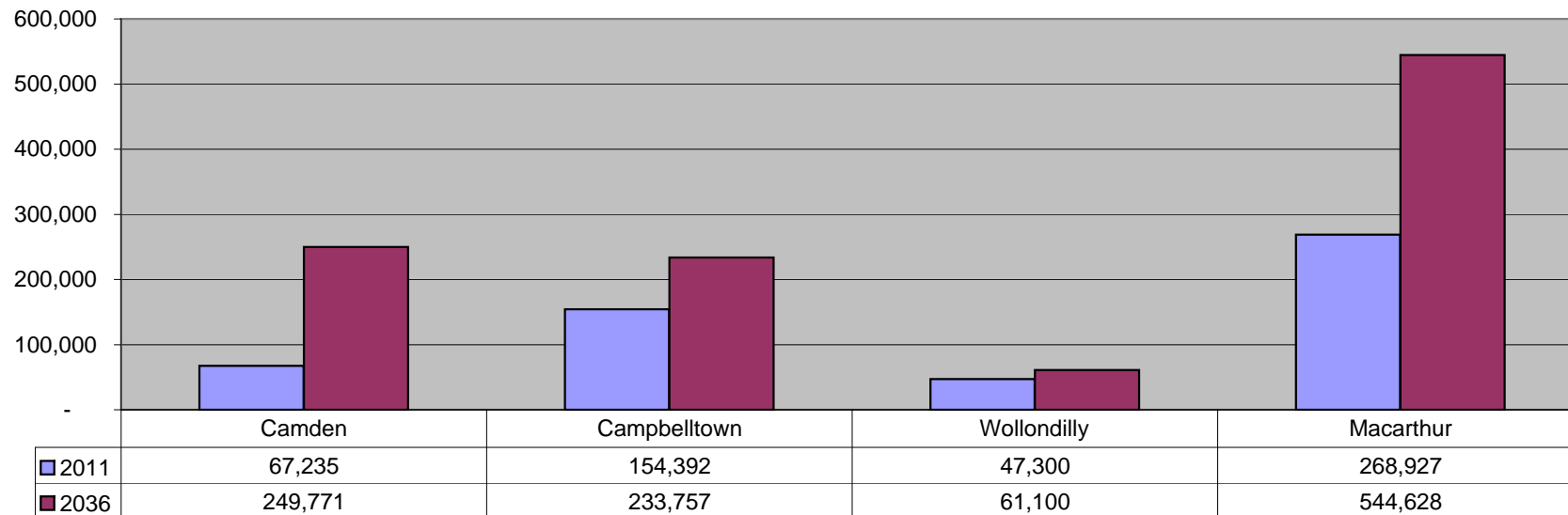

Population Forecast for Macarthur: 2011-2036



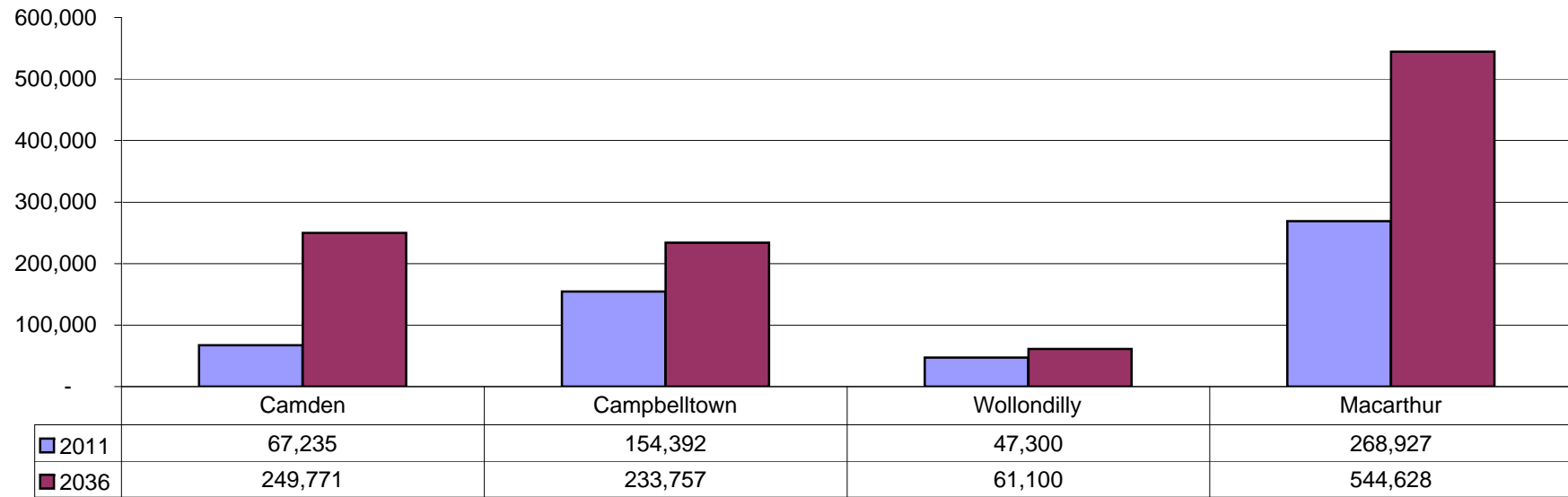

C 5. HOUSEHOLD TYPES

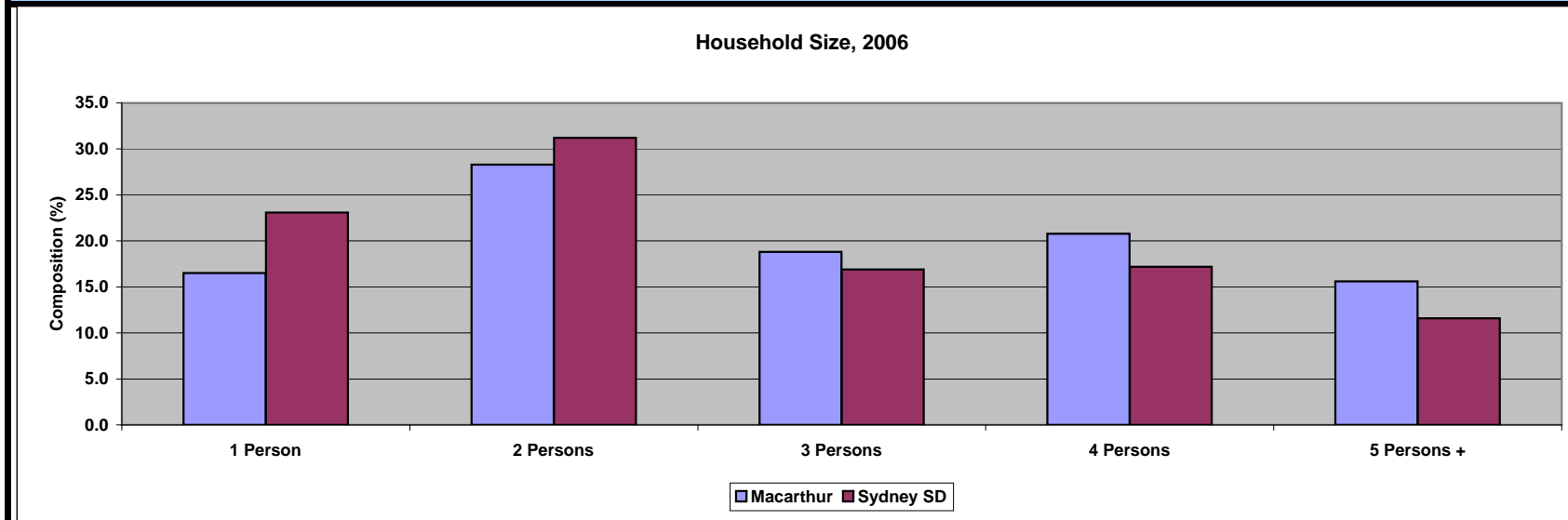
The 2006 Census recorded 77,437 households in occupied private dwellings in the Macarthur region. The average household size was 2.97, compared to 2.65 for Sydney Statistical Division (SD). Between the inter census period 1996-2006, the size of the household in Macarthur has shrunk with one and two person households becoming more prominent at the expense of larger-sized households. Almost 19,000 households representing 24.5% of the total households owned their own house, a much smaller proportion than for Sydney SD (30.1%). A larger proportion (43.6%) were purchasing their own dwelling, compared to Sydney SD (31.1%). Renters made up (25.3%) of the household when compared to Sydney SD (29.7%).

C 5.1 Major Highlights

The two-person family is the dominant household form in Macarthur as well as in Sydney SD as noted below:

- 🏠 Camden: 28.5% of the household comprised two persons, followed by four-person households (23.3%). Home ownership = 24.9%

- 🏠 Wollondilly: 30.1% of the household comprised two persons, followed by four-person households (21%). Home ownership = 30.7%
- 🏠 Macarthur: 28.3% of the household comprised two persons, followed by four-person households (20.7%). Home ownership = 24.5%

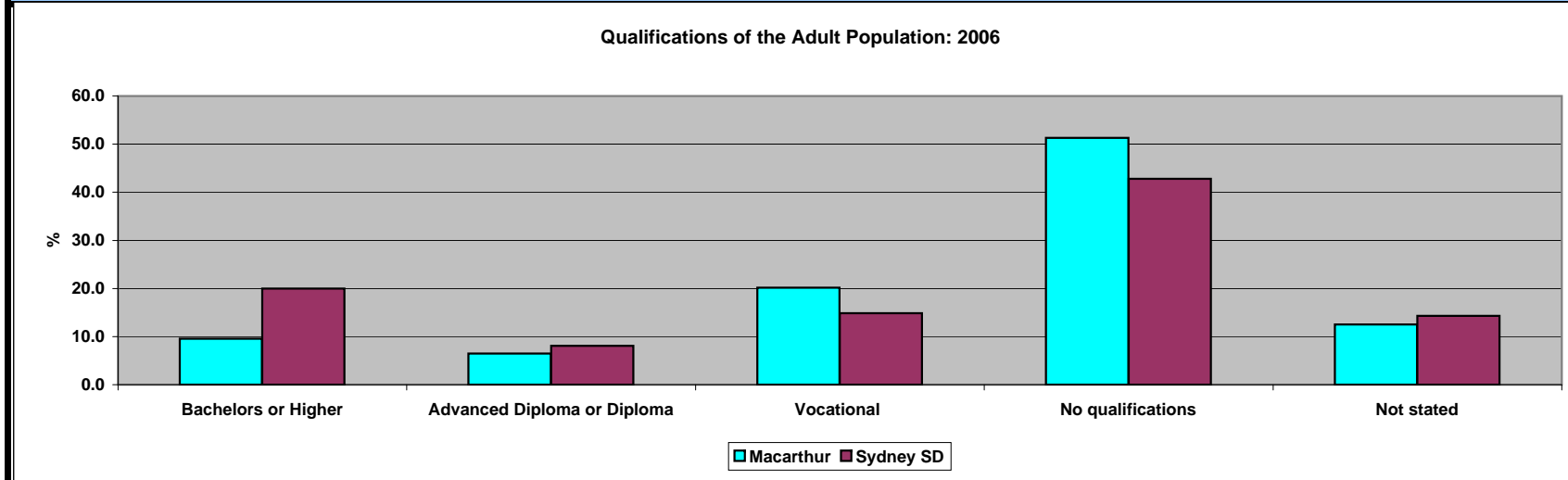

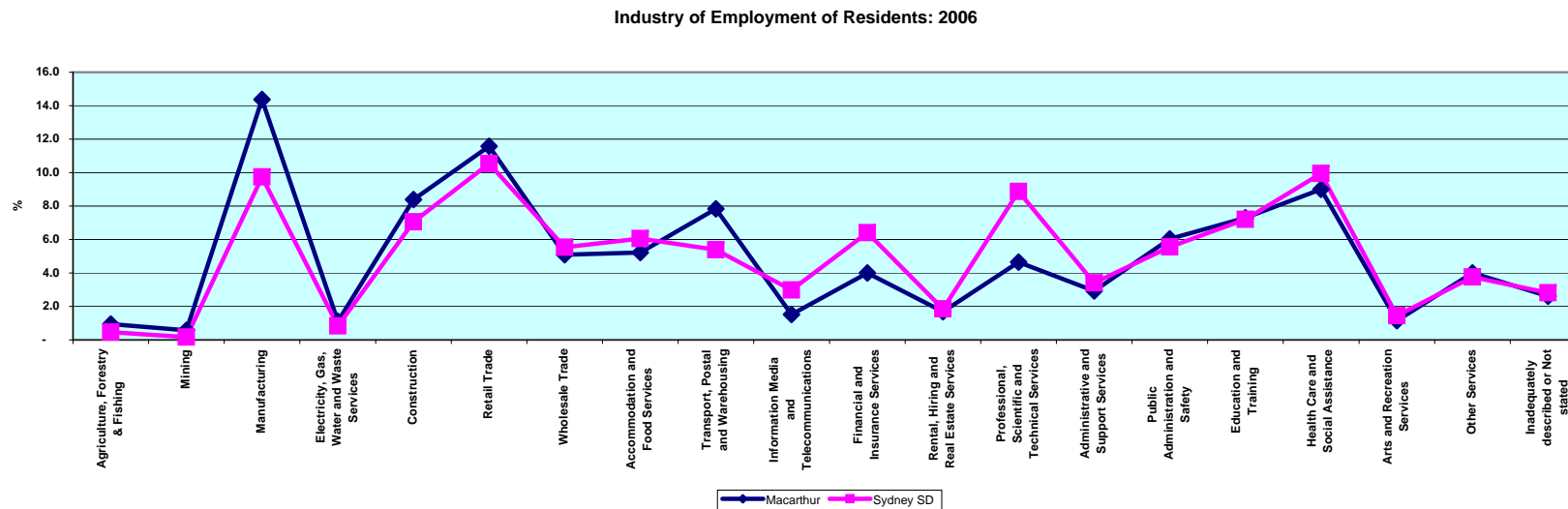

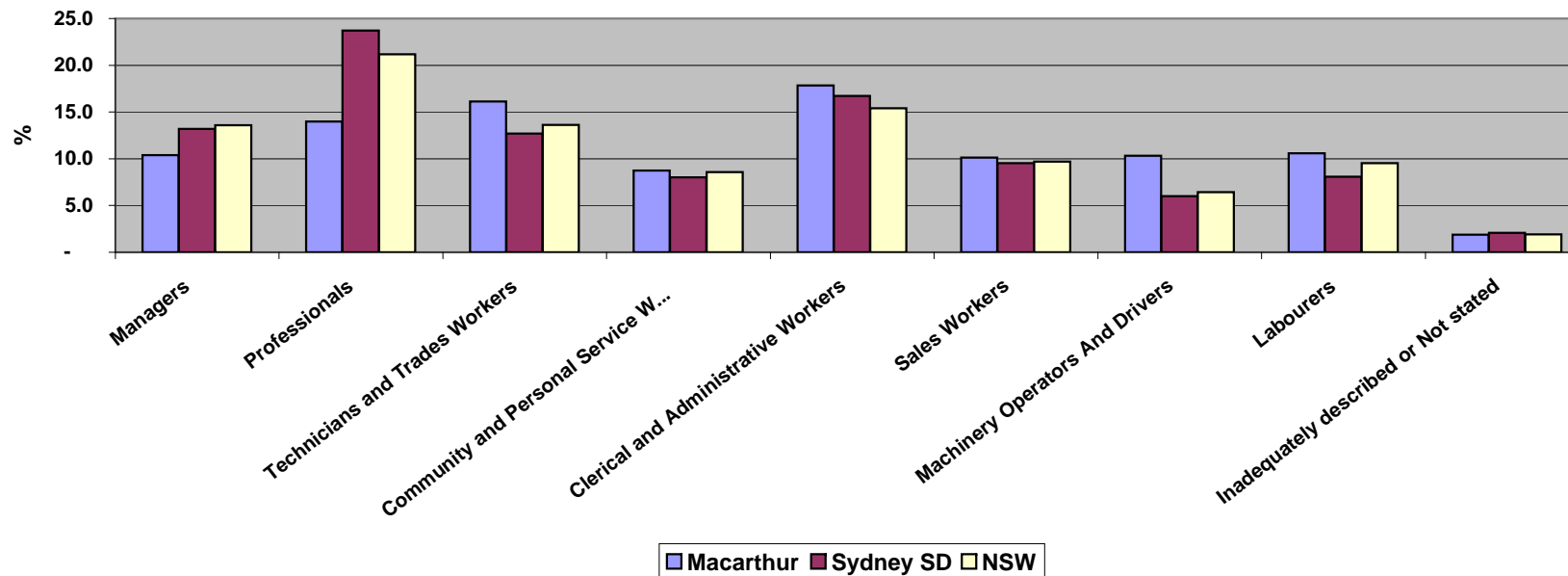

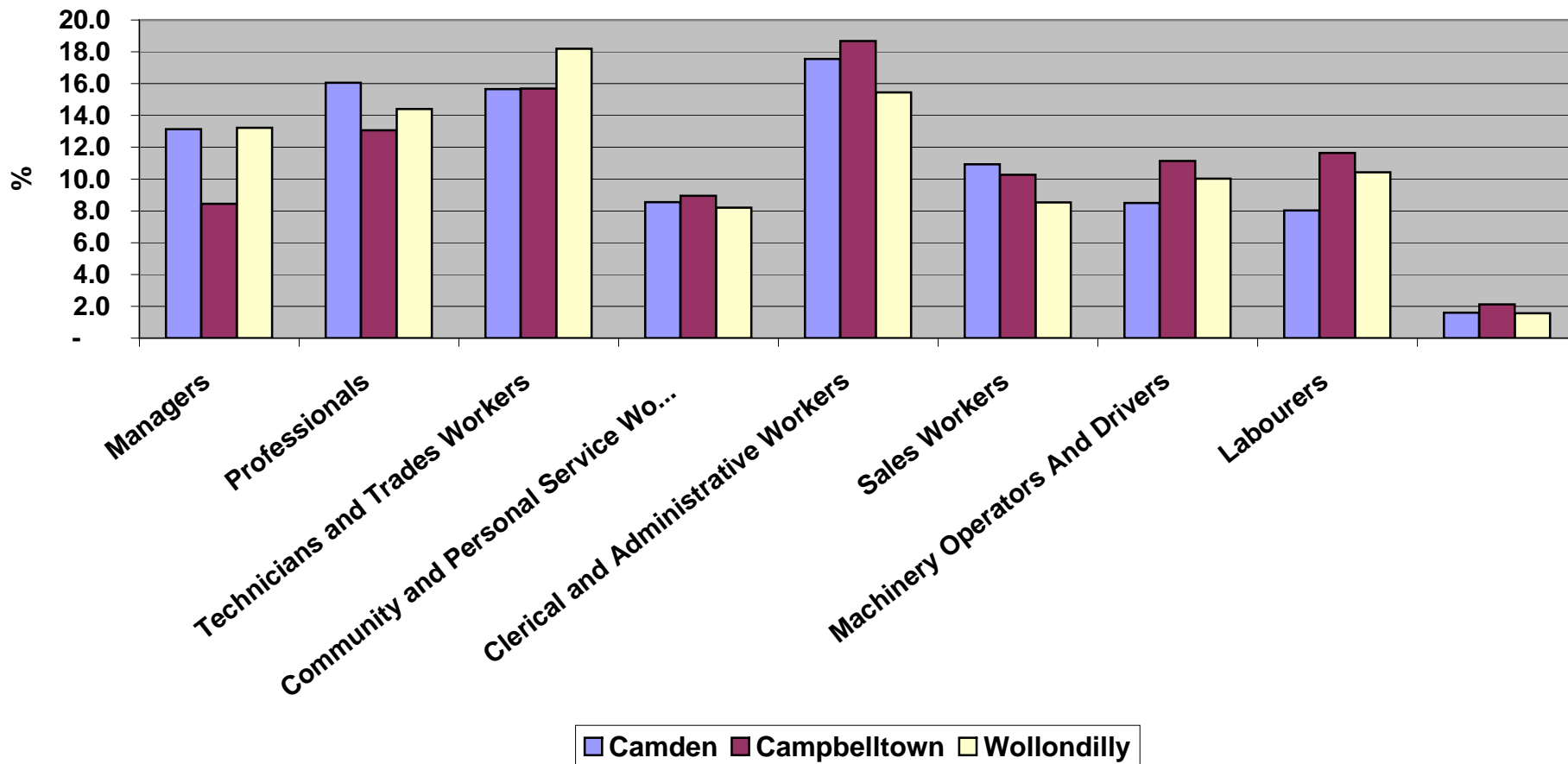

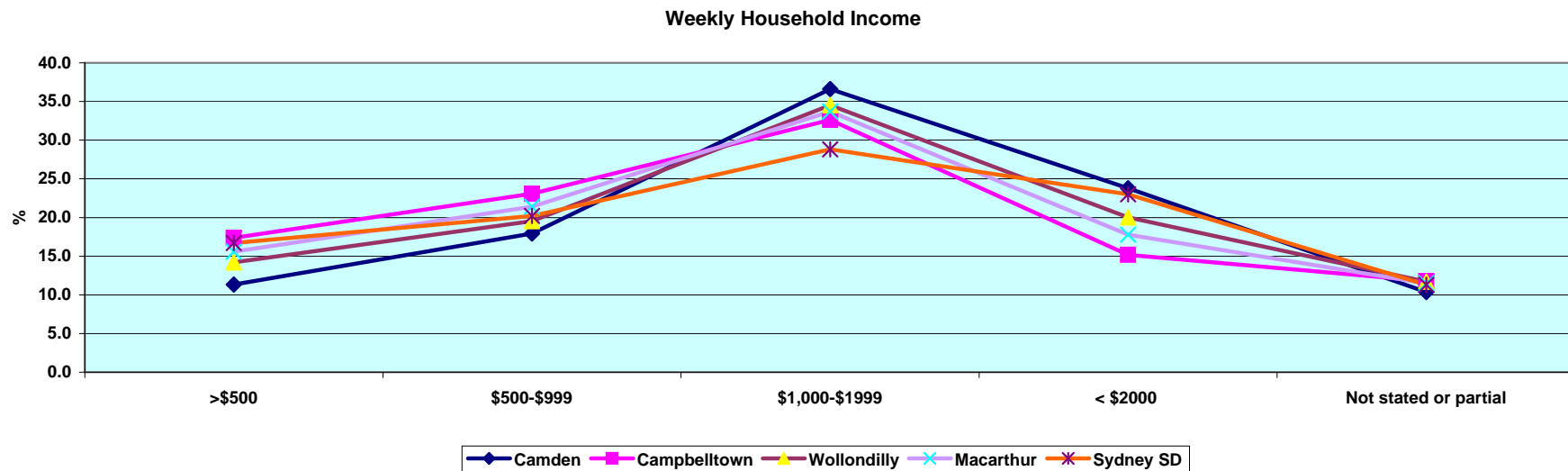

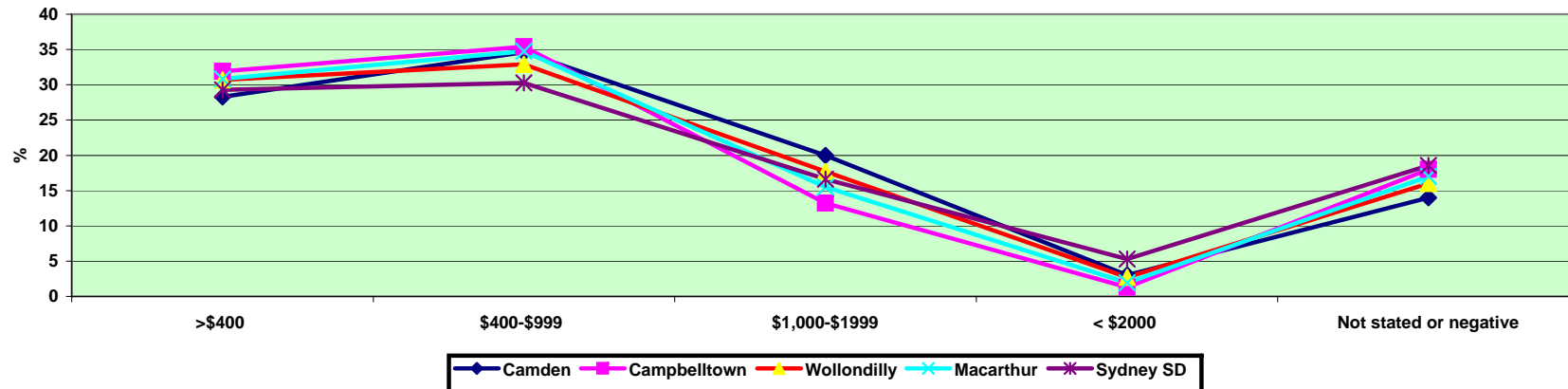

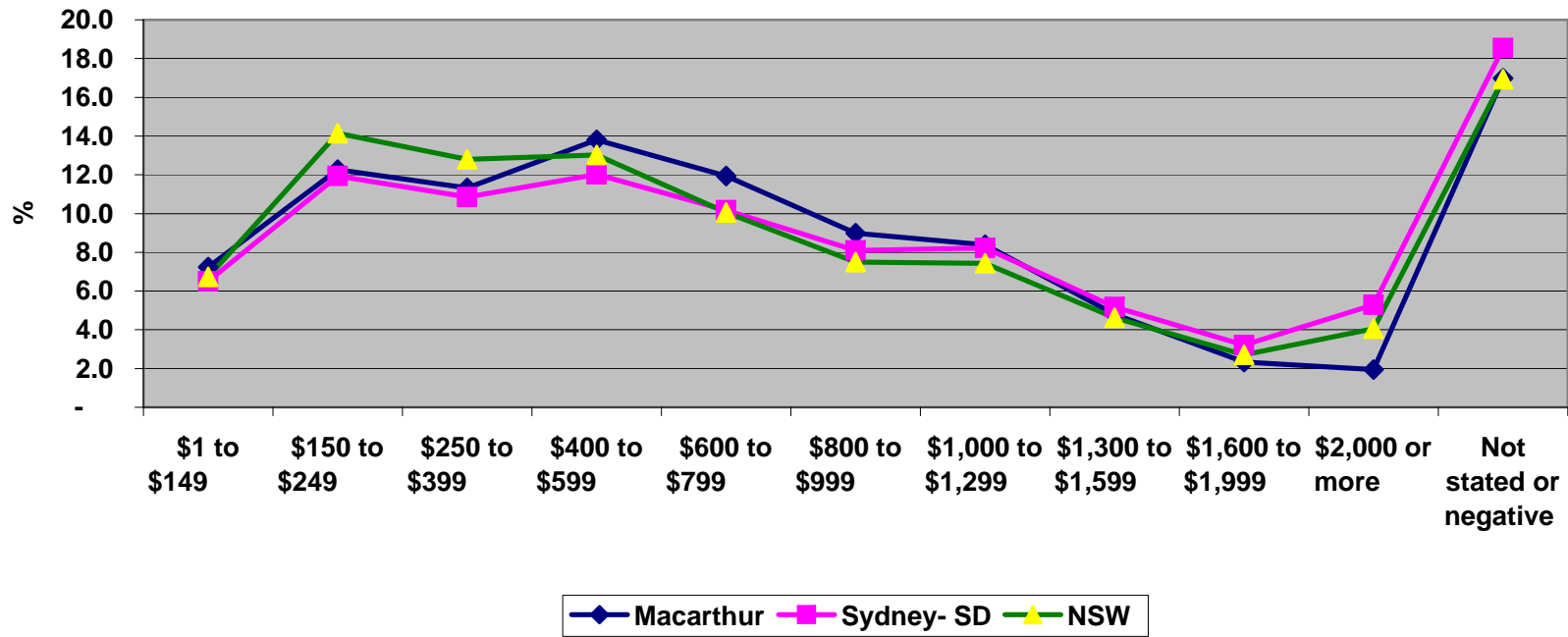

Macarthur's labour force was 113,526 in 2006 of which 106,536 were employed and 6,990 people were without a job. The unemployment rate was 6.2%. Of those employed 67% were in fulltime jobs whereas 30% were working part time. The labour force participation rate was 64.8%. Between 2001 and 2006 Macarthur's labour force grew by 5,544 or 5.1%. The number of people employed in Macarthur rose by 5,989 between 2001-2006, a rise of 6%. The rate of unemployment in Macarthur is generally higher than Sydney SD, although Camden and Wollondilly have usually recorded relatively lower rate of jobless people.

F 1.1 Major Highlights

The 2006 labour force and employment levels of the LGAs are shown in the chart below. More recent June 2010 data reveal that:

- 📌 Camden: 29,129 people were employed and 889 were unemployed, the unemployment rate was 3.0% of the labourforce of 30,018.
- 📌 Campbelltown: 73,080 people had jobs and 6,583 were unemployed, the unemployment rate was 8.3% of the labourforce of 79,663.
- 📌 Wollondilly: 22,744 people had jobs and 908 were unemployed, the unemployment rate was 3.8% of the labourforce of 23,652.
- 📌 Macarthur: 124,953 people had jobs and 8,380 were unemployed, the unemployment rate was 6.3% of the labourforce of 133,333.

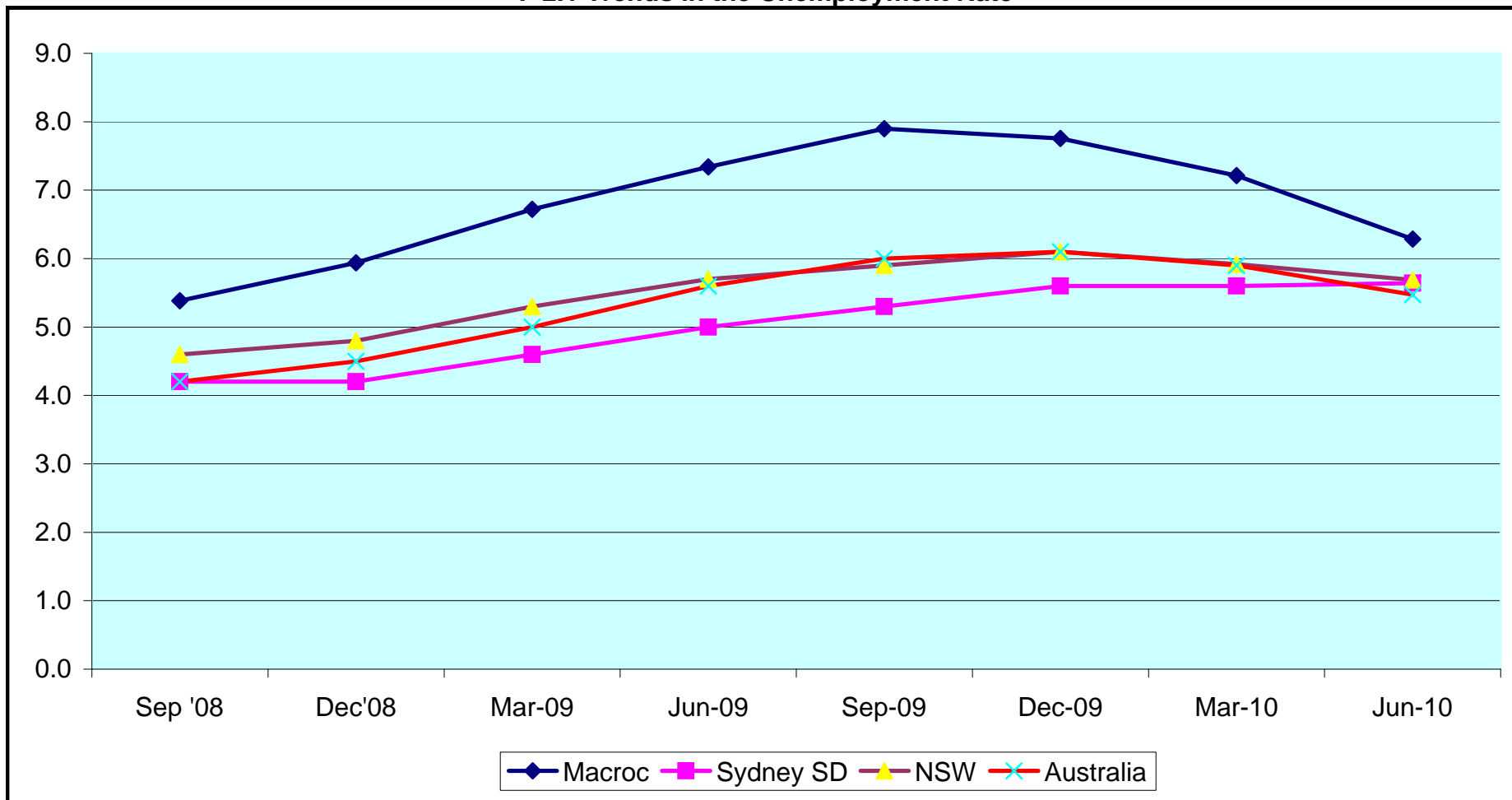

H 1 Housing

The 2006 census counted 81,476 dwellings in the region. 18,999 (24.5% of the the total dwellings) were owned and 33,768 dwellings or 43.5% were being purchased. Macarthur has a variety of housing choices. Rents and house prices are generally lower in Macarthur than in the Sydney region. The median house price in the Sydney SD was \$515,000 in June 2010 and the median weekly rent for a three bedroom detached house in September 2010 was \$390.

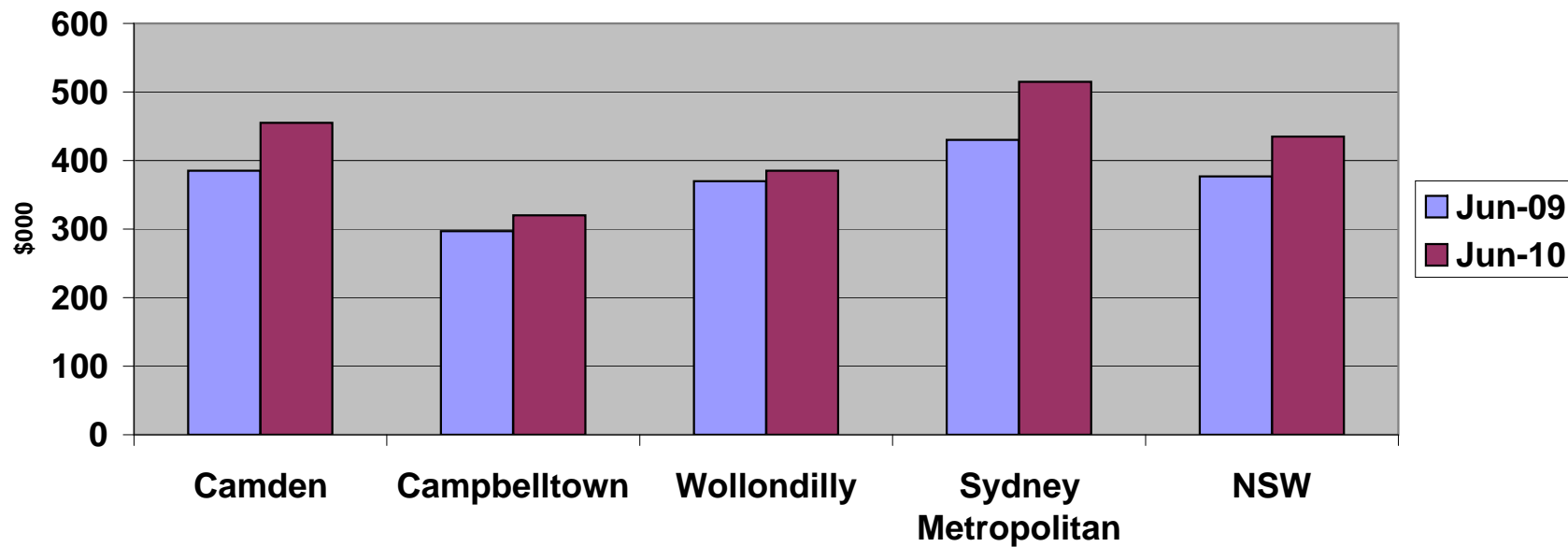

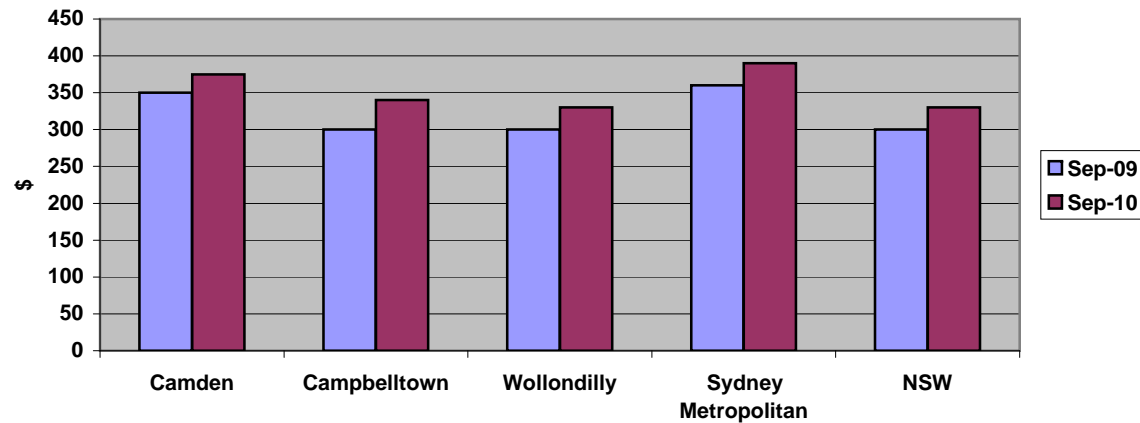
